



Superior Culinary Center Summer Camp Policies-2019

Registration is open now! Cooking Groups must have a minimum of 6 students. All classes are drop-off unless otherwise specified. Parents and guardians, please check your kids in promptly for class and return to pick them up after class.

Leftover Policy: Students make a full meal and eat the food they prepare at the end of each class with their group. Though there are often leftovers, the Junior Chefs are expected to share the leftovers with their group if they want to take a carryout home. No one student can take all the leftovers for their home.

Refund Policy: Full tuition is due at the time of enrollment. Fees are non-refundable and non-transferrable. All classes subject to cancellation or rescheduling. All meals and lab materials are included while at camp.

Multi-Week Discount Policy: Superior Culinary Center is pleased to be able to offer our Junior Chefs a 10% discount on enrolling in multiple weeks of camp. Sign up for 1 week at regular price and receive 10% off any additional weeks purchased.

Camp Transfers: Subject to availability, transfer requests must be made at least 10 days prior to the beginning of a session.

Safety First: We are committed to providing kids with a safe and positive environment. For campers aged 10 and under, we ask that you walk your camper inside each morning to drop them off, and come inside to pick them up each afternoon. You will be required to present identification. Only persons listed on the camper's information form are authorized to pick up and sign out your camper, unless a parent notifies us otherwise during camp. Under no circumstances will your child be allowed to leave our program with an unauthorized person.



Dress Appropriately: Make sure your child is dressed for comfort, safety and the current and forecasted weather. Avoid clothing with strings attached that may catch fire while cooking. Long hair must be tied in the back and closed toe shoes must be worn. Most camps will go outside, weather dependent for a daily lunch recess.

Allergies: If your child has an allergy action plan, please let us know at least 2 weeks in advance of your child's participation in the camp. Call (414) 671-1200 x1004 with your child's information. Camps follow the district policy governing use of EpiPens for allergic reactions. It is the parent's responsibility to communicate any special concerns to the Camp Director and to provide any necessary training to camp staff.

Medical Information: It is extremely important that we have all necessary medical information concerning your child.

Medications: If your child must take a medication during camp, the SCC medication policy requires written authorization to be on file at the camp in order for camp staff to administer all prescribed and over-the-counter medication. The authorization form must be signed by both a physician and a parent/guardian. All medications must be in its original container and clearly labeled. If any of these conditions are not met, we will be unable to administer medication.

Accident/Injury: If an accident should occur at our program, the Supervisor will advise the parent at the time of pick up in writing, unless it is a head injury.

All injuries to the head will receive an immediate parent phone call. If emergency treatment is warranted, the Supervisor will immediately notify the parent or guardian and the child will be transported by ambulance to the nearest medical facility, if necessary.



Beating the Sun: Due to the hot weather during the summer, we strive to ensure that the children are not outdoors during the hottest time of the day. There will be shade and water stations available. Help fight heat and dehydration by sending one or more refillable water bottles with your child. We recommend putting sunscreen on your child before your child comes to camp. Camps will not provide sunscreen for campers to use but assistance will be provided for young campers for reapplication

Superior Culinary Center Summer camp is "Nut Aware.": We have campers who have severe allergies to nuts including sesame seeds and hummus. Please respect this rule when you send food with your child. Foods that contain nuts, nut products or are produced in a facility that processes nuts need to stay at home. Campers with nut products in their lunches or snacks may be directed to eat in a safe area away from campers with allergies.

Behavior & Discipline Policy: Respectful interactions between campers, staff, and parents are essential to a successful program experience for all. Campers are expected to be able to participate in camp activities in a positive manner that is not disruptive for other campers or the camp environment. Bullying, fighting, inappropriate behavior or language, and/or continual disregard for camp safety, policies and procedures will not be tolerated. If inappropriate behavior occurs, camp staff will use strategies such as redirection, problem solving, and talking with parents. If positive outcomes cannot be achieved, SCC reserves the right to call parents for an immediate pick-up, suspend, or dismiss a camper from a camp without a refund.
